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Participant Spotlight Tharpe Named One of Five Argentum All-Star Apprentices of the Year

Argentum announced a competition for Apprentices of the Year with the goal of awarding a total of 5 Apprentices in healthcare to acknowledge what they do every day both as apprentices and in the senior living community. Employers nominated outstanding apprentices who work in their communities and 5 were selected across the country. Amanda Tharpe, CNA at Charter Senior Living of Paris, TN, was named as one of the five winners.

In 2020, Argentum received a Closing the Skills Gap grant to develop and expand nationwide apprenticeships in senior living and related allied health occupations. The Healthcare Apprenticeship Expansion Program (HEAP) collaborative was formed to address the skills gap in healthcare and healthcare IT occupations by expanding apprenticeship pathways for positions like Certified Nursing Assistants (CNAs), Licensed Practical Nurses (LPNs), Registered Nurses (RNs), rehab technicians, as well as creating new apprenticeship programs for healthcare leadership positions such as nursing directors and executive directors. Argentum and its partners plan to enroll and support over 7,200 apprentices by February 2024.

Argentum is working closely with several critical partners to successfully administer the grant and enroll apprentices. TalentGro, a division of Hamilton-Ryker, helps find and develop talent for employers and is serving as the apprenticeship intermediary to help HAEP employers launch and sustain their programs. Over a dozen employer partners within the senior living and healthcare industries have joined the HAEP collaborative since its launch and over 3,400 apprentices have enrolled in the program nationally.

Amanda Tharpe was one of those apprentices. Tharpe has spent 19 years building a rapport in senior care in the Paris, TN community. She earned her Nursing Assistant certification (CNA) at just 16 years old and has continued in the field building a career. Her employer, Charter Senior Living of Paris, writes "Amanda strives to become a Medication Technician and / or a Nurse in the next five years. She is always willing to be coached in the field and enjoys learning everything she can about senior care." Tharpe followed, "I never imagined that my first CNA job would set my entire life path. I fell in love with the way each resident warmed my heart. It became more than just a job, it gave me an overwhelming feeling of joy each day."

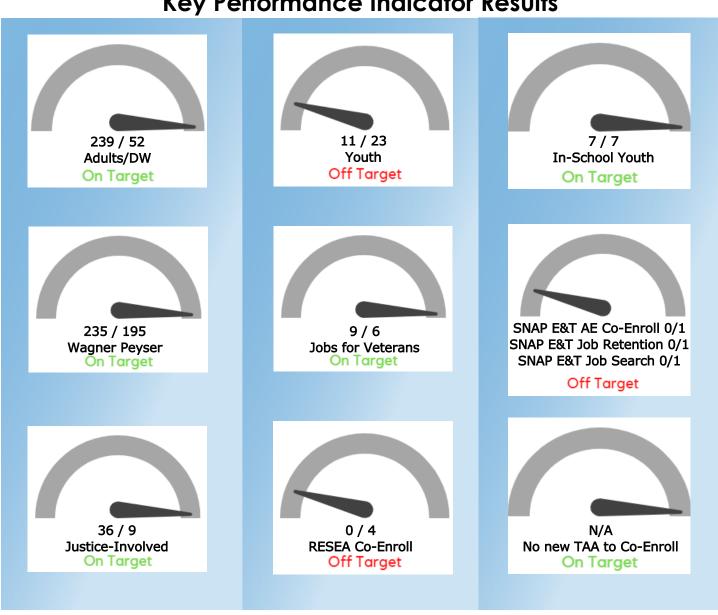
"Tennessee has an Apprentice of the Year for Healthcare! We are very, very proud of her," said Ruth Hamilton, TalentGro Division Director.

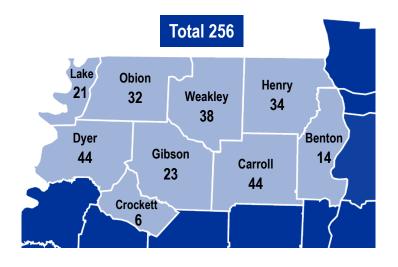

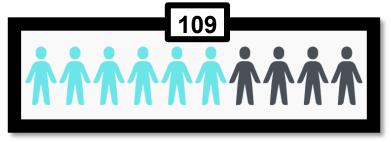
Total Enrollments by County



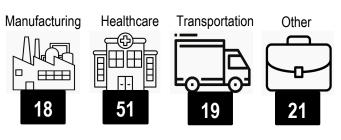
Priority Percentage of New Adult Enrollments



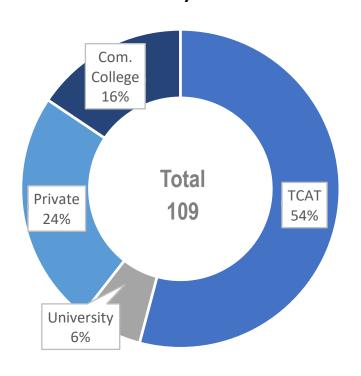
ITA Enrollments



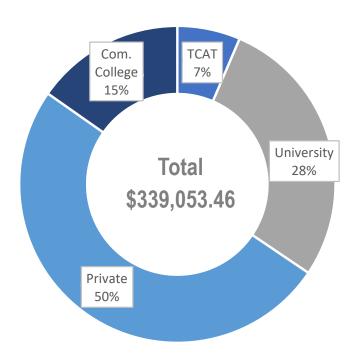
ITAs By Sector

Total ITA Investment by Provider

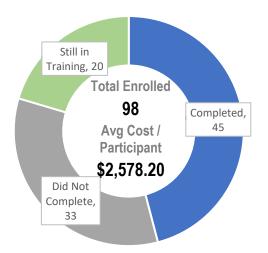
