



Temporary Assistance Title IV Vocational for Needy Families

In TANF District 7, the average wage for closed cases is \$9.40. 98% of cases with an achieved educational goal had a job in their field of study within 3 months, remaining the same from last quarter.

Rehabilitation

Vocational Rehabilitation served 717 customers in Northwest Tennessee. including 124 new enrollments during the last quarter. 27 were closed in successful employment.

Special Projects

June 27, 2019 was the reveal and Lunch-N-Learn Day of The Orchard House in Gibson County, the missing link to RAMP (Re-Entry Advanced Manufacturing Program). Opening in late Fall this year, The Orchard House will provide residential living, transportation, accountability, faith-based structured life along with job placement through FW United Group, LLC for men released from incarceration, homeless, or self-reporting to the Program in need of assistance with getting their life back on a track of self-sustainability. Many of our RAMP graduates from the Gibson County Jail are the ones doing the construction work on the facility and will be the first residents of The Orchard House.
