



Title I Career & Training Services



The Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) consists of five core partner programs: Titles I—IV, and Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF). These partners provide services through the American Job Center network in order to develop a quality workforce system to meet the needs of area employers and job seekers.

Temporary Assistance Title IV Vocational for Needy Families

In TANF District 7, the average wage for closed cases is \$9.37. 98% of cases with an achieved educational goal had a job in their field of study within 3 months, up from 87% from last quarter.

Rehabilitation

Vocational Rehabilitation served 824 customers in Northwest Tennessee. including 155 new enrollments during the first quarter. 35 were closed in successful employment.

Special Projects



The NWTWB and the AJCs of Northwest TN are excited to announce #WORKlife, a new youth work experience program to assist young adults transitioning from high school to either work or postsecondary education. Many graduate from high school without a plan of what to do next. Ideally, #WORKlife participants are placed in worksites that fit their unique career interests, and are able to learn occupational skills required of that position. Participants may work up to 37.5 hours per week for up to six months. In addition to gaining valuable hands-on experience and learning general work skills (i.e. soft-skills), such as attendance, punctuality professional communication, teamwork, etc., participants earn the higher of \$8.00 per hour or 80% of the typically wage paid for the position.
