## What is a Needs-Based Scholarship?

Needs-Based Scholarships are available through the federal grant program known as the **Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA).** 

WIOA's purpose is to offer a comprehensive range of workforce support programs through the local American Job Centers. The goal is to increase employment rate, job retention, and earnings, and also improve and advance participants' occupational skills.

## What Does it Cover?

1. Unmet Financial Need, calculated as:

Total Cost of Tuition, Fees, Books & Tools

- (-) Pell Grant
- (-) Lottery Scholarship
- (-) Other federal & state financial aid
- = Your Unmet Financial Need
- **2.** Participants may also qualify for travel stipends to reduce the cost of traveling to and from the training institution.

## Who is Eligible?

Residents of Benton, Carroll, Crockett, Dyer, Gibson, Henry, Lake, Obion, & Weakley who qualify as:

- Low Income
- Unemployed

• Workers, spouses, and dependents affected by a lay off

## **How Do I Apply?**

- Determine if the post-secondary education program qualifies. Institutions providing training services must be certified as eligible training providers and placed on a statewide list found on the "Education and Training Data" page of <u>www.JOBS4TN.GOV</u>
- 2. Complete an admissions application to the approved school of your choice.
- 3. Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (if available for your institution).

- 4. Call your local American Job Center and make an appointment with a Career Advisor to discuss how you can qualify for a Needs-Based Scholarship to cover your *unmet financial need*. Be prepared to bring your drivers license, social security card, income information, and any other documents requested by the American Job Center staff.
